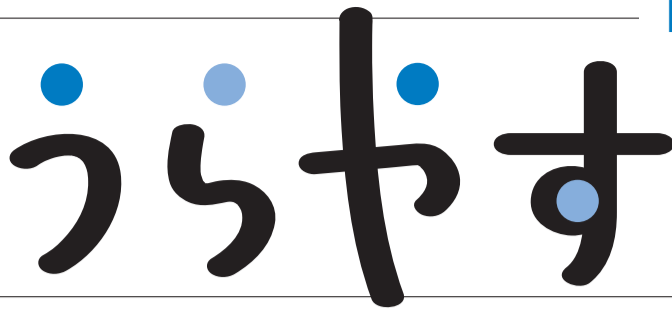

We are now accepting novel coronavirus vaccination reservations for all those who are eligible



To prevent novel coronavirus outbreaks, and reduce the number of deaths and serious cases to a minimum, our country continues to promote speedy vaccinations. Urayasu City has secured sufficient vaccines for all residents, and invites all who wish to be vaccinated to make a reservation. We will no longer be sending out postcards indicating vaccination reservation starting dates specific to age groups, as was initially planned.

Please keep in mind that even after you are vaccinated, there is still a risk of infection, so we ask for your cooperation in continuing to wear facemasks and taking precautionary measures.

Note: Vaccinations are available for children who have turned 12 years old or older by the date of their vaccination. Those under 16 years old will need to be accompanied by a guardian when receiving the vaccine. In addition, if you are a minor, please be prepared to contact your guardian in the case of an emergency.

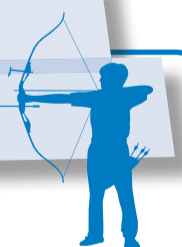
Vaccination vouchers for those aged 12-15 years have been sent



With all those eligible now being able to make vaccination reservations, vaccination vouchers for those aged 12-15 years (born between April 2, 2006 - July 31, 2009) have been sent out on August 6.

For those born after August 2009, vaccination vouchers will be sent out on their birthdays.

September 9 (Wed.) is "Emergency Medical Services Day"

It takes an average of 8 minutes for an ambulance to arrive. Precious lives could be saved if someone at the scene knew how to perform emergency treatments and cardio pulmonary resuscitation (CPR). No matter how small, everyone including children and adults can find something to do to help, and muster up the courage to act.

Currently, novel coronavirus infections are spreading. If you encounter a situation which requires you to perform CPR, please follow the procedure below:

1 A person has collapsed in front of you and is unconscious

2 Call 119 and ask for an AED

3 If the sick or injured person is not breathing, use a mask or similar item to cover their mouth and nose

4 Perform consecutive chest compression for two minutes and use AED



5 Handover to an emergency team

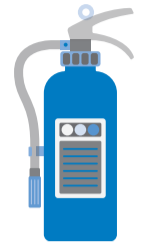
When performing CPR, "covering the sick or injured person's nose and mouth with a mask or similar item" is a crucial step in preventing infection. If a mask is not available, a handkerchief, a towel, or even clothing can be used.

Normally, artificial respiration is a part of CPR. However, in order to prevent the spread of novel coronavirus infection, refrain from performing artificial respiration on adults, but perform consecutive chest compressions for two minutes instead. For children and infants, performing artificial respiration is preferable. However, if you are concerned, refrain from performing artificial respiration and only give consecutive chest compressions for two minutes instead.

Please return rental fire extinguishers that have expired

The city carries out a fire extinguisher rental service. Among the fire extinguishers that are currently rented out, extinguishers numbered 120500 or under have already expired. If your fire extinguisher applies to this description, please return it to the fire department or a branch office. An old fire extinguisher may not be operable in cases of emergency, and if left unattended, it could even lead to a dangerous accident.



Those who live in or own rental housing

In principle, expired fire extinguishers should be returned by the owner of the building, but it can also be returned from the tenant or real estate management company. Please cooperate in returning them as soon as possible.

Those who are moving

Within the city: if you are moving within the city, please continue to use your fire extinguisher at your new address

Outside the city: if you are moving out of the city, please return your fire extinguisher to the fire station or a branch office

Note: If you live in a rental house and the owner of the building is renting the fire extinguisher, please return it to the owner

Collecting Used Cooking Oil, Used Clothes and Fabrics on September 8 (Wed.)

Date and Time: September 8 (Wed.), 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Location: Citizen's Hall (Urayasu City Hall 1F)

Eligibility: Used cooking oil from households, suits, shirts, sweaters, pants, towels, handkerchiefs, towel blankets, blankets, gloves, kimonos, sheets, curtains, neckties, and undergarments/socks/stockings (new or unused only) **Note:** For those coming by car, please use the multistory parking garage. Used clothes and fabrics must be washed and dried, and brought in clear bags.

Small rechargeable batteries like lithium-ion batteries are extremely dangerous because any external shock or pressure can cause them to ignite. Do not store or dispose small rechargeable batteries with garbage/recyclable garbage under any circumstances. Rather, please bring them to the Garbage-Free Section of Urayasu City Hall 6F or a business cooperating in recycling such as an electrical appliance store.
