If you encounter an unconscious person

If you find an unconscious person, providing first aid until the ambulance arrives can help

prevent the illness or injury from getting worse. Providing prompt and appropriate first aid will assist the EMS team in helping the person(s).

Emergency Medical Services

An audio quide will start playing when the AED is turned on. Follow the guide to apply the electrode pad and perform the procedure.



If you find an unconscious person, check your surroundings and ensure your own safety before administering first aid. Be aware that traffic accidents and the like can cause a fire.



September 9 is Emergency Medical Services day. By learning about the duties of the EMS team and how to perform first aid, you may be able to



If the person is not breathing, perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) immediately. Place both hands on top of each other and apply strong, unceasing compressions to the middle of the chest at a rate of 100 to 120 compressions per minute.


If the person is not responding to your voice, call for help and gather people who are willing to assist. Have them call 119 and bring an AED while you stay with the person.

Points to note when calling

When you call 119, the operator will ask you a series of questions necessary to dispatch an ambulance or fire truck. While it is natural to panic in the face of an accident or medical emergency, it is important to answer the questions calmly.



Is it a medical emergency or fire?

Location to dispatch

Provide the address or nearby landmarks such as buildings and intersections. If the emergency is inside an apartment or other large building, also provide the name of the building, floor, room number, and any other information you may have.

Ex: "The third floor of Urayasu City Hall, which is at 1-1-1 Nekozane, Urayasu City," "Intersection in front of Hinode Public Hall."

Current situation

Provide the condition of the injured or ill person. For accidents, also provide the cause of accident, number of injured persons, etc.

Caller's name and telephone number

The operator may call you back to check the location and other information. Make sure you are able to answer your phone until the ambulance arrives.

Use this service when you feel sick and are not sure whether to visit a medical institution or call an ambulance. In principle, a nurse will be available for consultation.

7 p.m. to 8 a.m. of the following day Consultation is available in the event of a child's sudden illness, such as a sudden fever.

Playing with fire is not a game

Many summer activities use fire, such as fireworks and barbecues. While these activities are fun, they can also lead to accidents such as fires and burns if rules are not followed and fire is handled inappropriately. To protect your loved ones and precious items, discuss with your family about the proper way to handle fire.

Do not let children play with fire!

In 2023, there were 363 fires caused by activities involving fire in Japan. Many of these cases occurred because children were playing with fire without supervision, leading to delayed detection and spread of fires. Lighters and matches were the cause of 195 and 83 cases, respectively.

To prevent fires caused by activities involving fire, adults must teach children the proper way to handle fire.



Follow the Rules for Garbage Disposal

A warning sticker will be attached to garbage that is not appropriately sorted according to the city rules. Make sure to follow the rules to ensure safe collection and avoid delays.

Wrong Days, Inappropriate Sorting

The reason why your garbage was not collected will be written on the warning sticker. If you let inappropriately disposed garbage accumulate, it will cause trouble with neighbors and interfere with collection. Make sure

to take back your garbage and dispose of it appropriately.

The School Ingrained in the Community

The extreme heat is continuing. If a heatstroke alert is issued, make sure to take thorough prevention measures such as staying in a cool environment and frequent rehydration.

The environment surrounding children is changing drastically. To improve the educational environment for children, who are the bearers of the future, the city has been implementing so-called "community school" on a trial basis since 2023 at two schools, Akemi Elementary School and Hinode Junior High School. "Community school" is a program in which schools, parents/guardians, and local communities cooperate and collaborate in school management. Starting this academic year, we have expanded the program to all municipal elementary and junior high schools.

The core organization for cooperation and collaboration in this effort is the School Community Collaboration Management Council. The council is

composed of school staff, parents/guardians, local residents, and others. In the council meetings, the principal of the school explains the basic policy of school management, and council members offer various opinions regarding school management and educational activities. This allows the members to approve various issues.

The purpose of this program is to allow the school and community to share issues, information, and goals, which will also promote efforts by the community to support the school. The knowledge and experience of the community will be shared with the students through these efforts, which will enhance educational and experience-based activities.

With the community looking over the children, crime and disaster prevention measures will also be improved. It will also nurture the love the children have for their community and make them more aware

Creating a community network around schools is beneficial not only for the education and healthy development of children, but also for the revitalization of the community and its aging population. With community schools as the gateway, we will continue to promote various initiatives to develop communities.
