the general division and Japan **Bicycle Club Federation (JBCF)** division. Participants will be further divided into classes such as Beginner and Challenge to compete. The criterium course, specially designed for this first event of its kind in the city, is a circuit that goes through Urayasu Beach Akemi and the Hinode areas. The course in about 1,900 meters per lap and has two U-turns and a chicane (serpentine curve). The chicane forces riders to slow down and show spectators their bicycle handling skills, their strategies for keeping the lead, and their powerful acceleration once they complete the turn. Come feel the sea breeze and watch the riders' exhilarating skills as they ride along the seawall.

A Stroll with the Mayor

Ryu-no-higemo



Sakaigawa River, which runs through the center of our city, is beloved as a symbol of our city by our residents.

Our River and City Development Plan, a project to utilize the space along the Sakaigawa River, was registered in August under the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism's River and City Development Support System. We will work

with the prefecture to receive national support and continue to develop the area as a place that enriches the lives of residents and a symbol of our lively town.

While Sakaigawa River is known as a place for relaxation and an important part of the city's flood control, it also plays a role in maintaining the ecosystem.

Have you ever heard of the aquatic plant ryu-nohigemo? Commonly known as the sago pondweed in English, this perennial aquatic plant grows completely underwater in fresh water or brackish water. Its Japanese name, ryu-no-hige (dragon's beard), describes the long, narrow leaves. It is a very rare plant that is designated as Near Threatened (NT) on the Ministry of the Environment's Red List, which means it is at risk of shifting to Endangered depending on changes in its living conditions. It is

also designated as a protected species (Rank C) on the Chiba Prefecture Red List. It has only been discovered in a few places in Chiba Prefecture, and one of these is the area between the East and West sluices of the Sakaigawa River.

The plant was first discovered in the area in 2005. In a survey conducted in 2022, it was found that the distribution of the plant in the area had expanded. Experts cited the non-concrete river bottom, relatively shallow depth that allows sunlight to easily reach the bottom, and the minimal sewage inflow, as factors that contributed to its growth. It was also pointed out that it is rare for the plant to thrive in rivers surrounded by residential areas.

We will think about ways to protect nature such as ryu-no-higemo, while also thinking about Sakaigawa River's functions in our society when developing and utilizing the waterfront areas.
